Transcribed Interview

This interview was done October 3rd between Detective Prudence Bickerstaff (Pru for short) of CSI and Terry Madison. Terry works part-time at Matilda J. Gibson Memorial Library. This interview was performed with consent at 10:15am and recorded.

For the purpose of this interview initials will be Detective Bickerstaff (DB) and Terry Madison (TM).

TM: OH! That's horrible. I would never want anyone dead.

DB: Well, your lack of being in the library placed him just in the place where he died.

Could it be that you planned that?

TM: I plan dinners with my family, and events for my church... not murders!

DB: No need to get upset, I'm just trying to put pieces together.

TM: I understand, but I did not want Mr. Bishop dead. I feel terribly about all of this.

DB: Do you know anyone who would want him dead?

TM: I don't think so. He's a nice young man.

DB: What is the significance of the white rose?

TM: I don't know. Do we have a white rose arrangement?

DB: No, you do not.

TM: Then I guess I don't know what you are asking.

DB: Aric was found with a quilt on top of him, do you know what the significance

Of this would be?

TM: Ann quilts... maybe they got into an argument.
