- Teens (grades 6 – 12) may sign up **Monday, June 7, 2021**. Beginning **June 14, 2021**, teens that are registered may pick up a take and make activity bag each week during the summer reading program. Completing these activities counts as a point towards their reading goal.

Adult crafts will be on **June 9th and 30th**. All materials are provided, but registration is limited to 10 adults. **Pre-registration is required** at Gibson Memorial Library.

Parent Cafés will be on **Wednesday's: June 2nd, 16th and 23rd** from **5:45 PM to 7 PM**.

A parent café is a chance to meet new people, make new friends, share parenting experiences and get ideas from other families, explore your family's strengths and challenges in a supportive community environment.

The Exercise Kit

Rosie the Riveters of Iowa presented by Linda McCann.

Rosie the Riveters are thought of as the women who worked in airplane, battleship, or munitions factories during World War II. But, within the Rosie community of women who worked during WWII, they include the babysitters, firewomen, garbage collectors, etc. who took the place of men, to keep the country functioning. Within Iowa, there were numerous munition factories; one aircraft factory in Des Moines, and all kinds of radio, clothing, etc. manufactures where Iowa women helped win the war. Linda was able to

speak with over 30 women who worked as Rosie's and shares their memories. Funding for this program provided by the Friends of the Library.
